Physiotherapy experience

Having qualified as a physiotherapist in 1988, I began to specialise in Neurology in 1990. I began to work with children and young people in 1992 within the NHS. I began to see clients in private practice in 2005.

My interest lies in making a real difference to the movement problems encountered by patients suffering from ongoing neurological problems. With good early management, hands on therapy and advice children can learn to develop improved movement strategies that can help them participate in activities that are valuable for the rest of their lives. My emphasis is on therapy being fun as well as functional, ensuring good cooperation and high levels of motivation. My work involves close partnership

with parents/ carers and other professionals in order to bring a whole package of support to each young person and their family.

I have a mixed case load of children and young people aged between 2 and 23 years old. Most of these have cerebral palsy and I provide physiotherapy in addition to that provided by local statutory services working both in home and education/care settings. As an advanced Bobath therapist, I provide specific hands on physiotherapy treatment. This may include respiratory management, stretching, strengthening, developmental activities, and specific exercises. I also provide advice and training for parents/carers/staff to ensure that everyone working with the child is able to help them achieve their targets.

I use activities including Riding for the Disabled, rebound therapy, Donkey riding, swimming/hydrotherapy/aquatic physiotherapy, mainstream gym, gymnastics sessions, soft play, sensory room/sensory experience to enhance physiotherapy outcomes.

My employment at Sheffield Hallam University involved teaching students on the undergraduate and post graduate, Masters degree programmes. My area of teaching speciality is Child Neurological Physiotherapy. I currently am involved in teaching qualified physiotherapists to improve their clinical reasoning and practice. I have taught nationally and I have presented at international conferences on Paediatric Neurological Physiotherapy and neurological theory. I have written a chapter in a book on Cerebral Palsy published in 2008. I have published work on Outcome measurement in Paediatric Physiotherapy. I have worked extensively with the Association of Paediatric Chartered Physiotherapists sitting on the national committee and working on several projects with the group over a period of 5 years.

All of this experience helps inform my current physiotherapy practice, ensuring my patients receive high quality care.
